Mrs. Carol Ferrell, Treasurer, gave her report.

Dorothy Johnson (8th Episcopal District) moved that that magnificent Treasurer's report be accepted with the highest accommodations, and seconded by Crystal Lewis (8th Episcopal District) and Sue Alexander (8th Episcopal District). The motion carried.

Dr. Pegues thanked Carol Ferrell for her excellent report.

Dr. Pegues stated that the Report Book did not have funds listed of \$12,248.25 on behalf of the 11th Episcopal District.

Dr. Hamb thanked everyone for sending funds to the HOPE Project Elnora P. Hamb Initiative. She indicated that no individual has been appointed to serve as leader or coordinator of the Initiative.

Dr. Nellie P. King stated that the Presidents are reporting funds for the HOPE Project.

D. Hamb stated that perhaps a Resolution should be written to provide a coordinator.

Ms. G. Bernice Richardson stated that perhaps the Elnora P. Hamb HOPE Initiative come under the umbrella of Overseas Missions.

Dr. Pegues stated that we would review this matter later.

Discussion on The Missionary Messenger Subscription Fee

Editor Juliet Waddell stated that one of the recommendations for the Missionary Messenger would be to increase the Messenger fee. Editor Waddell would like for the \$25 fee for the magazine changed from a subscription fee to membership to reduce the publication charges.

Editor Waddell stated that the change to a membership fee is a cost-savings strategy for the Women's Missionary Council and represents a reduction in publication costs from 32 cents to 16 cents per magazine. The United States Post Office and a local printer recommended the change to Juliet Waddell.

It was moved by Juliet Waddell to change the subscription fee to membership fee, and seconded by Doris Boyd.

Unreadiness:

Dr. Nellie King stated that the recommendation of changing the subscription fee to a membership fee was a By Law change that should be referred to the Committee on By-Laws.

The issue was referred to the Parliamentarian.
