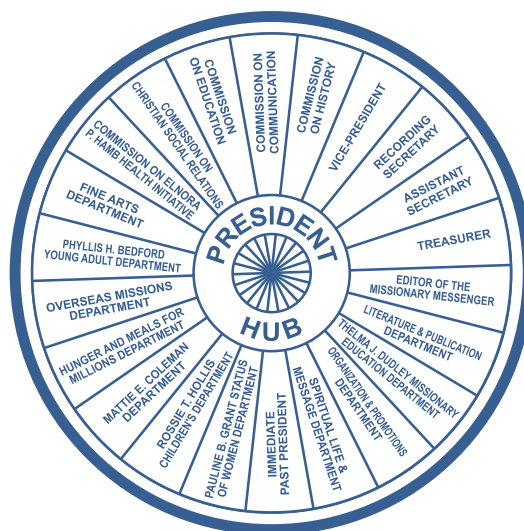

Bishop Thomas Louis Brown, Sr. was elected the 54th Bishop of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church on June 28, 2006 in Memphis, Tennessee. Bishop Brown was born June 21, 1951 in Oakland, MS, the eighth child of Stephen and Lillie H. Brown. His elementary and secondary education was attained at Walker High School in Oakland from which he graduated as valedictorian of his high school class. He attended Northwest Junior College, Senatobia, MS; and earned the Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of MS (Ole Miss) in 1973.

He matriculated at the Phillips School of Theology at the Interdenominational Theological Center, Atlanta, Georgia, from which he earned the Master of Divinity degree, with honors, in 1976. Bishop Brown also earned, with honors, the Doctor of Theology degree from the Interdenominational Theological Center (ITC) in cooperation with Candler School of Theology/Emory University and Columbia Seminary in

1991. He is a member of Theta Phi Honor Society. The ministry of Thomas Louis Brown, Sr. began during his junior year at Ole Miss when he answered the call to Christian Ministry. In the fall of 1973, he was admitted on trial in the MS Annual Conference by Bishop Joseph A. Johnson, Jr. and was assigned to pastor Rice Chapel in Durant, MS. In 1975 and 1976 respectively, Bishop Joseph C. Coles Jr. ordained him Deacon and Elder and admitted him into Full Connection in the Georgia Annual Conference. Bishop Brown's itinerant ministry in the C.M.E. Church has been extensive and thorough. In addition to Rice Chapel, he served Murray Memorial, Covington, GA; St. James, Columbus, GA; Butler Street, Atlanta, GA; and College Park, College Park, GA. He was the organizing pastor of the Good News Community Church in Lithonia, GA. From June 1990 until July 2006, Bishop Brown served with distinction as the sixth President/Dean of the Phillips School of Theology at the ITC. During his tenure, more than ninety-five students graduated. In 1996, it was under his leadership as Dean of Phillips that the Annual C.M.E. Pastors' Conference was established.

The 54th Bishop has served as adjunct professor of CME History and Polity as well as pastoral care at ITC; lectured at Candler School of Theology, (Emory University) and Columbia Theological Seminary, and Princeton Theological Seminary; and was a regular teacher and preacher with the Institute of Church Administration and Management (ICAM) now known as Conference of National Black Churches. Moreover, Bishop Brown has represented the church exceptionally well. He has been a delegate to the General Conference of the CME Church from 1978 to 2006; and was a delegate to the World Methodist Conference in Nairobi, Kenya, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil and Durban, South Africa. He is a founding member of Concerned Black Clergy of Atlanta, an advocate for the homeless and persons on death row. Civic participation includes the NAACP and other community organizations. Upon his election, the 2006 General Conference assigned him to the Fourth Episcopal District which encompasses the states of Louisiana and Mississippi. The accomplishments of Bishop Brown's 12 year tenure in the Fourth Episcopal District included the moving of the episcopal residence/office from Shreveport, LA to Jackson, MS; the purchase of a new episcopal residence and an episcopal district office for a total of over \$750,000. The mortgages on these properties were liquidated prior to the 2018 General Conference.

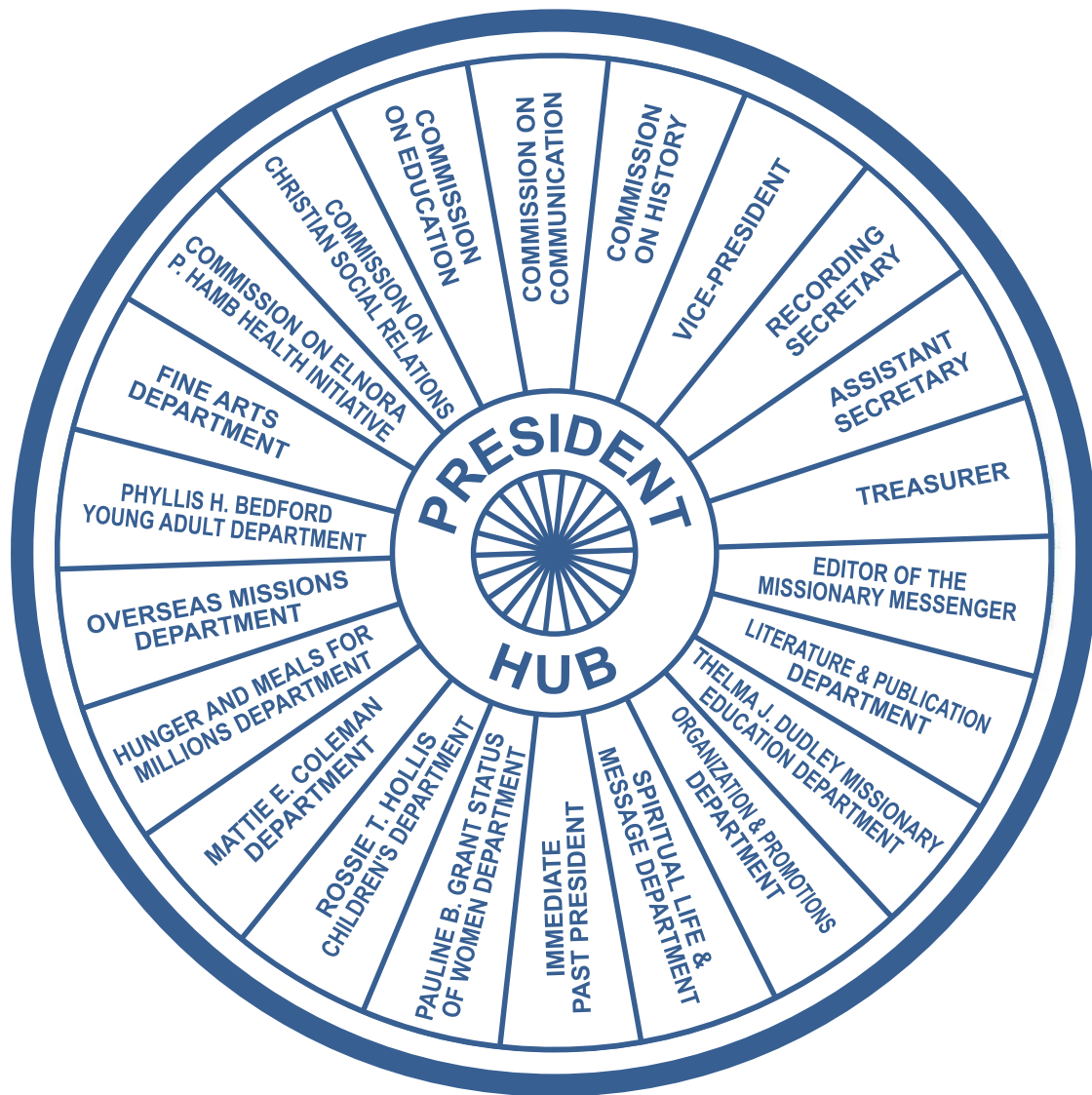
In June 2018, Bishop Brown was assigned Bishop of the Sixth Episcopal District, which encompasses four Regions in the state of Georgia. In the second year of his tenure, Bishop Brown has expanded the capacity of the District office and staff; and has challenged pastors and laity to embrace our quadrennial theme: "Bridging Worship, Discipleship, Evangelism and Stewardship Towards a More Vital Local Church."

Bishop Brown is married to Dr. Louise Baker-Brown. They are the parents of Charisa Nicole Brown-Jefferson and Thomas, Jr., the grandparents to Ariel Moriah, Kinston Albert and Alana Joel Jefferson, Orlando Thomas, Tyson Louis and Judah Elijah Brown. He is the Chair of the Department of Christian Education, member of Boards Interdenominational Theological Center, Phillips School of Theology, Payne College Board of Trustees and Co-Chairman of the Conference of National Black Churches (CNBC).

Rev. Amina S. McIntyre is a playwright and Creative Worship Artist. An Atlanta native, she is the only daughter (second of three children) of Sgt. Victor B. McIntyre and Rev. Lavonia K. McIntyre. Rev. McIntyre has a thirst of education and hold the following degrees: a Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology at Colby College in Waterville, Maine, a MA in African American and African Diaspora Studies from Indiana University, Bloomington in Bloomington, Indiana, a Masters of Fine Arts in Creative Writing from Spalding University in Louisville, Kentucky and Masters of Theological Studies from Emory University.

As a playwright, Rev. McIntyre has had productions and readings of her plays with Working Title Playwrights at OnStage Atlanta, Wabash College, Colby College, Lenoir-Rhyne University, Spalding University, Sabrina McKenzie Ministries at the Porter Sanford Theater, the Hickory Museum of Art, Fort Wayne Fringe Festival, the Atlanta One Minute Play Festival, Atlanta History Museum (permanent “Gatheround” Exhibit) and Oaklan Cemetery. Rev. McIntyre was the 2011 Visiting Playwright in Residence at Lenoir-Rhyne University, a featured presenter at 2011 Isothermal Community College Writing Workshop, a finalist for the 2011 New York Theater Workshop’s Emerging Artist of Color Fellowship and the first Blackacre Conservancy Writer in Residence (June 2016).

She was the recipient of a 2013-2014 City of Atlanta Office of Cultural Affairs Individual Artist Grant to write about the Atlanta homeless “Tramp Trail”, co-coordinator of the Spalding Homecoming Play Festival and 2014 Spalding Alumni Play Workshop Facilitator. Additionally, Rev. McIntyre was a Playwriting Apprentice in the Horizon Theatre 2014-2015 Apprenticeship Company, the 2014-2016 Atlanta Region Young Ambassador for the Dramatist’s Guild, and the 2015 Ethel Woolson Lab Recipient through Working Title Playwrights. Rev. McIntyre was the Managing Director of Karibu Performing Art, LLC, a small theatre company in Atlanta, GA and co-founder of the Hush Harbor Collective. Additionally, Rev. McIntyre was commissioned to write a play for Found Stages Pod Plays and Onion Man Production’s “State of DisUnion” Festival. Her play, *One The Third Day*, was produced at the Vanguard Repertory Theatre in Atlanta, GA in August 2018.

Accepting her call into the ministry in 2008, Rev. McIntyre is an ordained Elder in Full Connection in the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church and served as 6th District Director of Specialized Ministries for Arts and Drama. She has previously pastored at St. Lewis CME Church in Sparta, GA and currently on the staff at West Side CME Church. Her ministry led her to release the book *30 Days of Peace and Praise*, a devotional guide with daily activities. Rev. McIntyre was elected as the CME 2016-2020 Connectional Young Adult Ministry (CYAM) President, served as a Chaplain Resident with the Seton Healthcare Family in Austin, TX. She currently spends time between Atlanta, GA and Nashville, TN where she is a doctoral student at Vanderbilt University and spends times writing and ministering.

Amina’s goals are to continue considering the intersection of theology and theatre and ways in which Young Adults use their gifts within the church. Moreover, she hopes to provide a platform for people of all ages to use the arts to explore how God resides within themselves.

At the District level, she served as president of the Board of Christian Education and the president of the District Women's Missionary Society. Currently, Louise serves as the secretary of the District Board of Christian Education and Formation, a member of the District Lay Council, and is the Secretary, Thelma J. Dudley Missionary Education Department of the District Women's Missionary Society. She currently serves as the Annual Conference assistant secretary. She also serves as the Adult Department chairperson on the Regional Board of Christian Education and Formation and is a member of the Lay Council. Louise is also a member of the Region Women's Missionary Society where she serves on the Secretary of Spiritual Life and Message. At the Connectional level, she has served as the chairperson of the Life Membership Committee for the Women's Missionary Society, and was elected to serve as Secretary, Spiritual Life and Message Department in 2019. Louise also works with the Department of Christian Education and Formation of the CME Church. 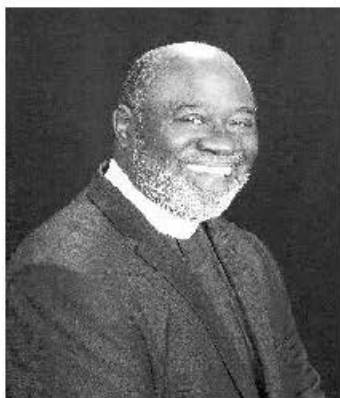

The Historic Mt. Pisgah C.M.E. Church

Reverend Willie Ward, Jr. was appointed as the 40th pastor of Mt. Pisgah Christian Methodist Episcopal Church in June 2008. An overview of his anointed ministry includes, but is not limited, to the following highlights. Pastor Ward, a native Memphian, was reared in the Binghampton Community and attended First Baptist Church on Broad Avenue as a child. Under the guidance of the late Reverend H. C. Cherry, he accepted Christ and was baptized at the age of eleven.

Before being placed in a pastoral position of nurturing and leading God's people, Pastor Ward experienced 30+ years of management in diverse and challenging workplace environments. He has an Associate's Degree in Management Technology from State Technical Institute at Memphis, a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration from LeMayne Owen College, and a Master's Degree in Christian Studies from Union University.

After accepting the call into the ministry, Pastor Ward was licensed to preach in the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church in July 1995. His first assignment was in Piperton, Tennessee as a Supply Pastor at Mt. Hebrew C.M.E. Church in October 1996. In July 1997, he was appointed as Pastor of Washington Chapel C.M.E. Church, where he was blessed with 10 years of dedicated service to the congregation and community.

Pastor Ward formerly served 18 months as the First Episcopal District Prayer-Call Facilitator (Seven Days/Week). He formerly served as Chairman of the West Tennessee Region Annual Conference Board of Trustees. Currently he's serving as Chairman of the Northeast District Finance Committee, Chairman of Greater Memphis Area CME Ministers' Alliance Finance Committee, Chairman of the West Tennessee Region Joint Board of Finance, and as a member of the First Episcopal District Technology Center Board of Directors.

Pastor Ward partners with Economic Opportunities as a "Shepherd" counseling with 12 men as part of a prison outreach ministry and the City of Memphis' "Manhood University" community outreach ministry, which is designed as "Another Chance" program for disadvantaged men.

Pastor Ward is committed to his ministry and to his family. This is evidenced by the fact that he and his wife Dorothy have been married for 44 years. They have three children, six grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren. In his every day walk and his every day talk, Pastor Ward's personal goal is to lift Jesus up, thus allowing Him to draw all men unto Him. The Spelman College Glee Club History

The Spelman College Glee Club has maintained a reputation for choral excellence since 1925. The organization is open by audition to all students of the

Spelman College community. The repertoire consists of sacred and secular choral literature for women's voices, with a particular focus on traditional spirituals, music by African-American composers, music from many cultures and commissioned works.

The Glee Club has traveled throughout the United States and performances for a variety of audiences. Past performances include concerts halls such as Faneuil Hall in Boston, the Brooklyn Academy of Music, Avery Fisher Hall at the Lincoln Center, as well as churches, high schools, colleges and universities nationwide. The group's international travels have taken them to Brazil, Canada, Italy, and most recently Portugal. The organization's highlight was a March 2016 performance at the White House for President Barack Obama.

The Glee Club is the premier performance organization for the College and sings for most campus events. It has the unique opportunity to perform with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, The Dance Theatre of Harlem, Ms. Patti LaBelle, Ms. Aretha Franklin, as a part of the annual Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. celebration and at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church, where they honored victims of the Charleston, South Carolina, church shooting. Our Glee Club spends many hours training and practicing in preparation for each performance and are committed to lifting their voices to encourage others through song and with each performance, audiences are left in awe.

The Glee Club recently celebrated the 92nd year of their Annual Spelman-Morehouse Christmas Carol Concert. Held with the Morehouse College Glee Club, this concert is featured annually on National Public Radio and Georgia Public Broadcasting during the holiday season. Other major performances include the Annual Spring Tour during the College's observation of spring break and an Annual Spring Concert at Spelman.

Past directors include the late Kember Harold, Willis Laurence James, Dr. Roland Allison, Aldrich Adkins, Ruth B. Stokes, and Dr. Norma Rabon. Over the years the Glee Club has grown to a membership of 80 phenomenal students. The Glee Club is currently under the direction of Kevin P. Johnson, D.M.A. associate professor of music at Spelman College.

We are truly grateful to each of you. *This report is given in memory of my beautiful mother, Mrs. Dorothy M. Isabel, my sisters, Montine and Juliette. I'm sure they are smiling down on me at this very moment with their love!*

**“We’ve Come This Far By Faith”
Leaning on the Lord

The Women’s Missionary Council will turn 102 years old on September 7, 2020. *“What a Might God We Serve”!* Our early missionaries were bold, willing to step out on faith to try new things and pursue their God given dreams and passions. Dr. Mattie E. Coleman was such a woman who became the first Black female physician to become a Tennessee State Tuberculosis Advisor and Counselor. Mrs. Helena B. Cobb was the first Vice President of the Council. Mrs. Cobb was named by the General Conference in 1906 as the first Editor of the Women’s Missionary Age, a magazine for the Women’s Missionary Society organization and begun by Bishop L. H. Holsey in 1904. It is known as the Missionary Messenger, today.

Mrs. Helena B. Cobb opened the first Institute for Girls in Barnesville, Georgia on October 7, 1909 under her leadership as principal. The Helena B. Cobb Industrial Institute was built in the Washington Park area of Barnesville, Lamar County, Georgia. The enrollment was over 200 girls yearly. After her death in 1922, the school held its final commencement at the West Mount Sinai Baptist Church, Barnesville, Georgia on May 24, 1923. Our foremothers were Brilliant African American women! *“Women Who Stepped Out on Faith and Did What They Had the Power to Do”!*

I am very appreciative to our President of Presidents, Ms. Sheila Holman, and to every Regional President, and their entire region which includes the Local and District Missionary Societies. *“If it Doesn’t Happen on the Local Level, it Doesn’t Happen”!* Dr. Sylvia Faulk,” Seventh President of The Women’s Missionary Council of the CME Church, The Social Activist, is responsible for this statement. Regional Presidents, you have done a fantastic job!

To our Division Leaders, and all Departmental Secretaries, Committees, Commissions Chairs and Affiliate Organizations: *God Bless you for the magnificent work you’ve done!*

I am elated, overjoyed and extremely proud to announce the total amount given for the “Lena Jones Rice Missionary March” is \$539,896.15. To our President of Presidents, Regional Presidents, District and Local Presidents and to every Missionary assembled here today:

James 1:22-25 (NKJV) states: *“But be doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer to the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; for he observes himself, goes away and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does.”*

“May God Bless and Keep Each of you”!

The Executive Board has lost a powerful influence throughout this nation and abroad, “Dr. Sylvia Moore Faulk”, The Seventh President of the Women’s Missionary Council of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church from 1987-1995, ‘The Social Activist’! Dr. Faulk served as President of the North America Area World Federation of Methodist and Uniting Church Women. This organization includes representation from the AME, AMEZ, CME, United Methodist and the Methodist Church in the Caribbean and Americas (MCCA). She also served on the boards of the National Council of Churches, Church Women United, The National Council of Negro Women, Black Women’s Agenda and Ecumenical Decade: Churches in Solidarity with Women.

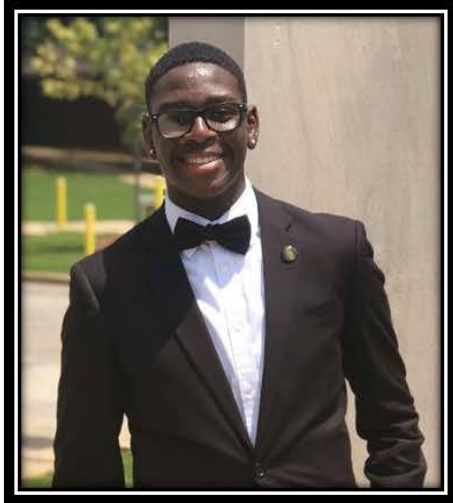

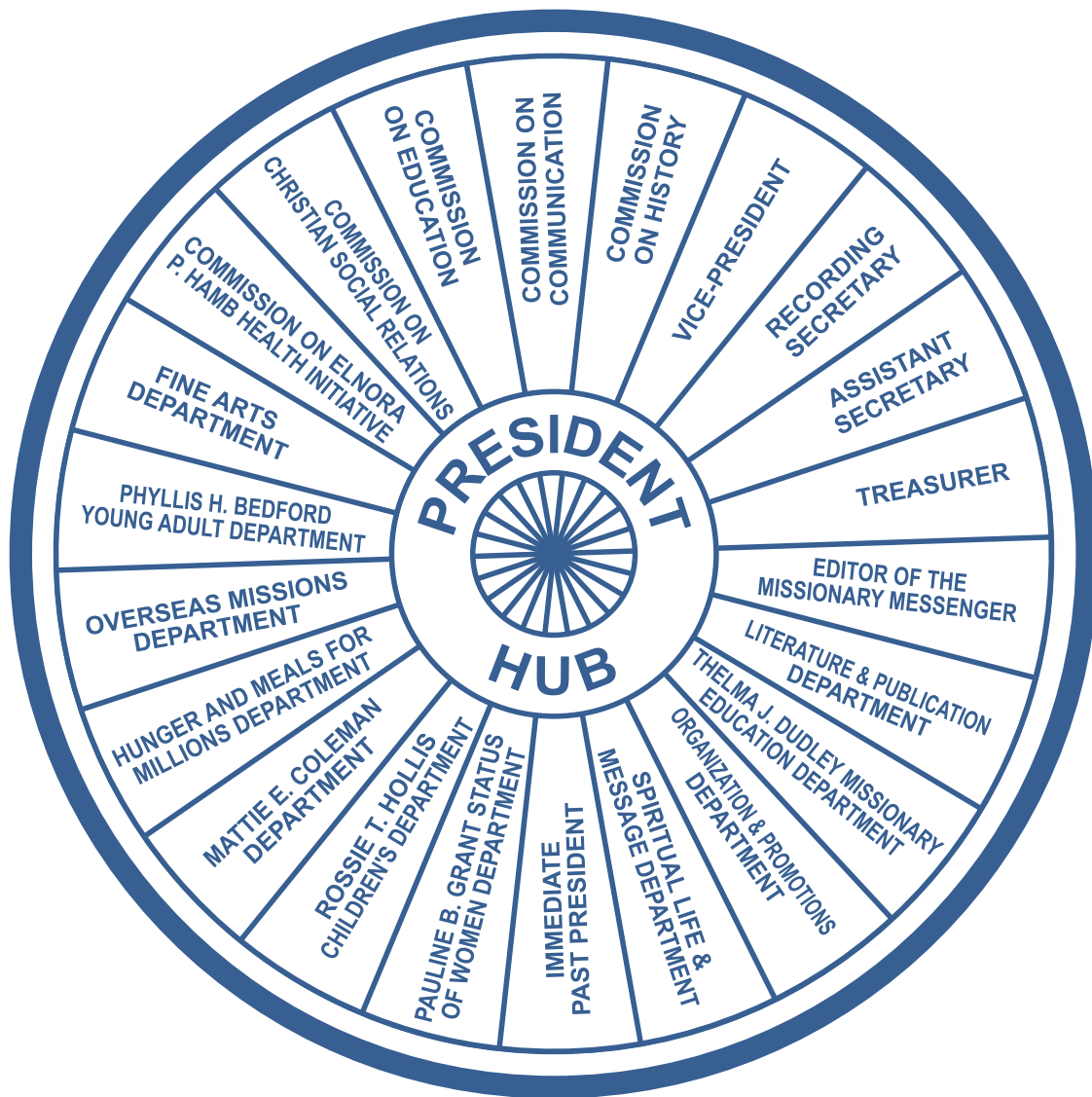
